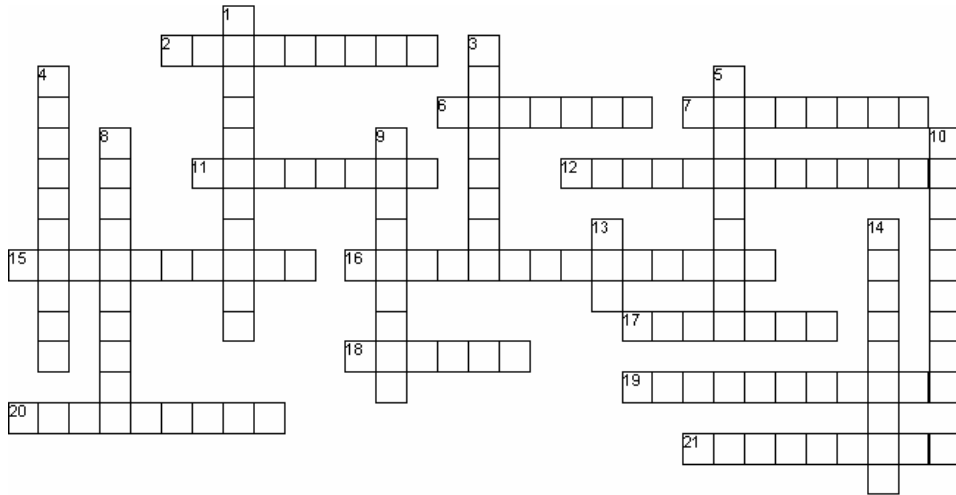


Wildlife Research Crossword Puzzle
